MEDEA Awards 2008 Announces Last Call for Participation

Date of Release: 9 September 2008



The MEDEA Awards 2008 is entering its final weeks for accepting submissions **as the closing date for submissions is 30th September 2008***. The MEDEA organisation has already received submissions from 15 countries and the number is growing. This is the final chance for those among Europe's educational and creative professional producers, amateurs, supporting staff, students and teachers to submit an educational project in which media (moving images, sound, media-rich applications, virtual simulations ...) plays a vital role.

Five finalists will be invited to the Awards Ceremony on Thursday 4th December 2008, where they will have the chance to win and receive the first MEDEA Award. Prizes for 2008 will include the award itself and hardware to the value of 6,000 Euro.

This ceremony will take place alongside Online Educa Berlin, the world's largest international conference on technology supported learning and training, where a special session will be dedicated to the finalists of the MEDEA Awards 2008.



The organising committee is delighted to make this announcement and look forward to a very high level of participation. Interest in the Award is already high in keeping with the increased level of interest and expertise in the use of media in education.

A spokesperson for the committee highlighted the importance of this Award in the context of our media-rich environment stating:

"Only when video and audio are routine components of education and online learning will we have an educational environment that reflects the media-rich world in which our learners not live."
